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## Common Phonological Error Patterns Quick Reference

What is a phonological error pattern? Phonological pattern errors, also known as phonological processes, are systematic simplifications or substitutions of sounds in a child's speech. Most of these patterns are present in typically developing children's speech and help children simplify the complex adult speech they hear into manageable chunks. These errors, however, typically resolve as children develop.

Why do they matter? When errors persist after a certain age, the productions are no longer considered typical development and may require explicit instruction to remediate. Recognizing these patterns aids in understanding and addressing children's speech development and subsequent interventions.




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
